

Express Scripts Recruitment Fraud Alert

We would like to advise applicants of recruitment fraud scams which may impact your employment search with Express Scripts and our subsidiary companies.

Scammers have been known to use a variety of methods to lure applicants into thinking that they are working with an actual Express Scripts Representative in order to gather personal or financial information. These individuals may utilize a company's logo, names of executives along with detailed company information, to make it appear as though employment offers are legitimate.

Applicants should be aware that:

- Express Scripts will never require an applicant to pay a fee to anyone as part of the application process. In addition, we would never send applicants any type of check to cover "training or equipment" expenses.
- Applicants who correspond with Express Scripts recruiters should be aware that communications via email originate from @express-scripts.com email addresses. We do not utilize @gmail.com, @yahoo.com, @aol.com or any other generic/common email address.
- While Express Scripts does conduct telephone interviews, we would never use any public chat rooms or instant messaging providers to do so.
- Employment offers or communications which include grammatical or spelling errors should be considered suspect

Individuals who believe that they have been a victim of a Recruitment Fraud should:

- Immediately file a report with their local Police Department.
- Contact their financial institutions (Bank, Credit Card Company, etc.) and report the incident.
- Submit a complaint to the Federal Bureau of Investigations Internet Crime Complaint Center at <https://ic3.gov>
- Contact any one of the 3 credit reporting agencies' fraud alert departments and place a fraud alert on your credit report.
